Уважаемый участник Олимпиады!

Вам предстоит выполнить ряд тестовых заданий и одно письменное задание.

Выполнение тестовых заданий по чтению целесообразно организовать следующим образом:

Задание 1:

– не спеша, внимательно прочитайте задание;

- прочитайте пять описаний людей и подчеркните ключевые слова;

 подберите для каждого описания человека/людей текст, который содержит все ключевые моменты описания;

– чтобы удостовериться в правильности выбранного ответа, подчеркните те части текста, которые соответствуют ключевым моментам описания.

Задание 2:

- прочитайте текст с целью понять его общее содержание;

– десять предложений, которые Вы должны определить как «истинные» или «ложные», даны в том же порядке, в каком информация представлена в тексте;

 прочтите первое предложение и начните читать текст с целью найти нужную информацию;

– для ответа на каждый последующий вопрос Вам не нужно перечитывать весь текст целиком, только ту его часть, которая содержит требуемую информацию.

Выполнение лексико-грамматических тестовых заданий целесообразно организовать следующим образом:

Задание 1

– не спеша, внимательно прочитайте задание и текст с целью понять его общее содержание;

- вернитесь к началу текста и внимательно прочитайте пример;

- начните выполнять задание с первого пропуска;

– удостоверьтесь, что образованное Вами слово подходит для данного предложения по смыслу и грамматически.

Задание 2:

– не спеша, внимательно прочитайте задание и приведенный пример;

– в задании пять полных предложений, объединенных общей темой;

 после каждого полного предложения идет предложение с пропуском, который Вы должны заполнить одним, двумя или тремя словами, при этом смысл полученного предложения должен полностью совпадать со смыслом исходного предложения;

- проверьте правильность написания слов;

– Вы не можете добавить более трех слов (краткие формы *«isn't, don't»* считаются как два слова);

 внесите в лист ответов только те слова, которые Вы использовали для заполнения пропуска.

- Не забудьте перенести свои ответы в лист ответов.

При выполнении письменного задания важно, что

- Вы должны написать личное письмо;
- в своем письме Вы должны в полной мере раскрыть заданную тему;
- Ваше письмо должно соответствовать заданному объему. Предупреждаем Вас, что:

при оценке тестовых заданий, где необходимо определить один *правильный ответ*,
баллов выставляется за неверный ответ, а также, если участником отмечены несколько ответов (в том числе правильный), или все ответы;

PART 1 READING

Task 1

The people below all want to find a place to stay.

Read the descriptions of places to stay.

Decide which holiday accommodation would be the most suitable for the following people. For questions 1-5, choose the correct letter (A, B, C or D).

- 1. **Dina and Sam** want to stay in the countryside with all meals included. They don't drive, so they need to be near the train or bus services. They want to go horse-riding and see some wildlife.
- 2. Yuki wants to stay no more than a fifteen minute walk from the city's main attractions. She wants to be able to have dinner in different places every evening and go to concerts and plays.
- **3.** Micky and David want a quiet place where they can ride horses and then go into the city centre for a drink. They don't have much money, so they want to cook their own meals.
- **4. Sebastian** wants to stay in or near the hills. He wants to climb some of the highest hills but needs an experienced walker to accompany him. He needs to use email to contact his family.
- **5.** Tom and Sheila want to stay in a quiet place with a car park and be able to drive to the city centre in under fifteen minutes. They want dinner at the hotel and a swimming pool for their children.

The Best Hotels, Hostels and Guesthouses

Find your ideal place to stay ...

- A Clarendon House is a family hotel in a peaceful location 10 km from the city centre, but with a good 24-hour bus service. Although only breakfast is provided, there is a fully equipped kitchen for quests to use. Horses are available for hire and there is a large swimming pool very near the hotel.
- B The Mountain Hostel is in the middle of very high hills and can be reached only by car. Without telephones, computers or television, this is an ideal place to relax. All meals can be provided, but the hotel also has a kitchen for guests to cook if they wish to. There are daily guided walks to see the local wildlife.
- E The Castle Hotel is a half-hour drive from the city centre and very close to the railway station and motorway. Breakfast and lunch are provided and there is a good restaurant 20 metres from the hotel. The hotel offers evening concerts by local musicians and has wide-screen television and Internet services.
- F The Four Seasons Hotel is in the hills but within walking distance of the railway station. It has a restaurant which serves breakfast, lunch and dinner, all cooked with the best local produce. The area is good for fishing and riding and the hotel organizes tours to see birds and rare plants.

- C Jeremy's Guesthouse is in a beautiful valley in the hills. Riding, tennis and golf are all available locally and the owner, an expert in mountain climbing, organizes walks. The nearest village is 10 km away, but the guesthouse offers everything you may need, including all food, theatre performances by a local group and free access to internet services.
- D The Greenway Hotel is a twenty-minute drive from the motorway and only ten minutes on foot from the city's theatre area. Meals are not provided (except breakfast), but there are several good quality restaurants nearby. Internet and email services are always available. The rooms are comfortable and very affordable. There is a large car park for guests.
- G The Farley Guesthouse is on the seafront and all rooms have a view of either the beach or the hills behind the hotel. A number of sports are available, including surfing and tennis. Breakfast and lunch can be provided on request. There is a good restaurant, a cinema and an internet café nearby.
- H The Sunrise Hotel is only a ten-minute drive from the city centre but away from the traffic and noise. It has a swimming pool, a gym and a large garden. Breakfast and dinner can be served on request, and there is a café nearby which serves lunch. There is parking space behind the hotel.

My first long motorbike trip – by Graham Jones

I began riding motorbikes when I was eighteen years old, as a passenger on the back of my friend Luke's bike. It was a classic motorbike – big, fast and noisy! Our first few rides were short trips – which he was very careful to make as enjoyable as possible for me – and as a result I fell in love with the whole motorbike experience almost immediately.

After a couple of months of shorter rides, we went on a longer group ride with Luke's motorcycling club, which he said would give me a good idea of the pleasures and difficulties of motorcycling. We rode approximately 100 km in one day, and it was a great experience – although we only managed to get less than half of the way to our destination. The ride was wonderful and we had beautiful weather as we went along the quiet roads. However, after we'd stopped to have a rest and were about to carry on riding, one rider in the group, Tanya, suddenly found her bike wouldn't start. Some people in the group finally managed to get it going, but in the end Tanya had to turn round and go back home by herself, knowing that if she stopped anywhere, she wouldn't be able to start her bike again. She bravely decided she could ride back home alone, but I doubted whether I'd have such a confident attitude in the same situation.

Our group then drove on to the mountains and stopped for some lunch – and that's where things started to go wrong. The weather turned bad and it began to snow. Then, without asking anyone, the leader of the group had the idea of going in a completely new direction up a steep mountain road, with corners that would be difficult for motorbikes even when the weather was good – and by now it was snowing quite heavily!

When we finally made it to the top of the mountain, Luke was annoyed. He said it was too risky to be on a mountain in such bad weather, and that we should go back down. We were both frozen when we reached the bottom, despite our cold-weather clothes. However, when we got back to my house we both began to see the funnier side of it all, and I immediately asked Luke when we could go again. I realized I could handle the worst of times on a motorbike, and there and then I made up my mind to try and save up for one.
